RE-HOMING AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT

1. Rehoming is a service provided to SPR members who can offer a suitable new home to a rescue bird.
2. This agreement sets out the terms on which Safehaven Parrot Refuge (SPR) offers birds for rehoming by you as a Guardian. These arrangements may only be changed in writing by a trustee of SPR.
3. The legal ownership of all birds re-homed with a Guardian remains with SPR. Nothing shall operate to transfer the ownership of any bird to a Guardian.
4. The Guardian accepts full responsibility for the health and welfare of the bird entrusted to him and will provide a brief report on the bird's welfare and condition to SPR on each anniversary of the rehoming date.
5. Re-homed birds must not be loaned, rented, sold, exchanged, traded or given away nor shown, displayed or used for any commercial or egotistic gain nor for breeding except with the prior written permission of SPR.
6. The Guardian must immediately notify SPR of any change in his or her residential address and of the address at which the re-homed bird is located.
7. In the event of the death of a re-homed bird the Guardian must provide to SPR a certificate indicating the cause of death within 15 days by an avian veterinary surgeon or a veterinary investigation centre approved by SPR.
8. The Guardian will at his own expense arrange comprehensive insurance for the re-homed bird in an insurance office of repute in the full value of the re-homed bird to include cover for claims by members of the public and other third parties for loss, damage or injury caused by the re-homed bird and for veterinary treatment. The policy will be taken out by the Guardian in the joint names of himself and SPR if SPR so requires. Otherwise, the Guardian will ensure that the interest of SPR as owner of the re-homed bird will be noted on the policy. In any event the Guardian will produce a copy of the policy and evidence of the payment of the premium to SPR annually when sending to SPR the report mentioned at 3 above.
9. SPR reserves the right to investigate unannounced the living condition of any re-homed bird. The Guardian grants to SPR a right of access to the premises at which the re-homed bird is kept for the purposes of that inspection.
10. No Guardian may refer to SPR in any way in any advertisement or publicity without the prior written consent of SPR.
11. All members of SPR are expected to conduct themselves at all times in a manner which does not bring the name of SPR into disrepute or conflict with the objects or practices of SPR.
12. In the event of any breach of these conditions SPR may require the immediate return of the re-homed bird and if the re-homed bird is not returned by the Guardian to SPR within 14 days of such demand, the Guardian will pay to SPR as liquidated damages the estimated value of the bird.
13. All charges made in the rehoming of any bird or arising from any breach of this agreement shall be borne by the Guardian who will indemnify SPR against all expenditure, costs and claims.

14. SPR may from time to time introduce regulations relating to the care of re-homed birds. The strict observance of those regulations shall be a further obligation of the Guardian. (A copy of the current regulation is attached.)
15. Where there is more than one Guardian for a re-homed bird or birds these terms and conditions shall apply to all such Guardians who shall be jointly and severally responsible for the performance of them.

REGULATIONS REGARDING RE-HOMING OF BIRDS.

1. Cages or aviary must meet SPR specifications (details available on request).
2. All birds must be maintained humanely with protection from cold, heat, wind, rain, direct sun, all predators and all adverse conditions. The bird must not be placed in a hazardous situation where accidents could occur.
3. The bird's location must be free of any adverse air pollutants such as chemicals, sprays and cigarette smoke.
4. Each bird shall be supplied with a wide variety of food suitable for the particular species plus vitamins, trace elements and amino acids. Junk food must not be given.
5. The Guardian must provide the bird with all appropriate and desirable veterinary care in the case of sickness, disease or injury.
6. The Guardian must keep SPR informed of the health of all birds in his or her care and immediately contact SPR in event of injury, illness or any other adverse condition which may arise.
7. You should refer to SPR for advice if you are considering flight restriction or micro-chipping of a rehomed bird.
8. Any advice required by a Guardian regarding the health or welfare of a re-homed bird must be sought from SPR only. Please do not seek advice from elsewhere (this includes "behaviourists") without first obtaining the permission of SPR.
9. SPR does not condone holiday boarding for non-SPR birds. You should not take in boarding birds unless you follow our procedures which are available from SPR. Failure to observe this requirement may result in the immediate return of your re-homed bird.
